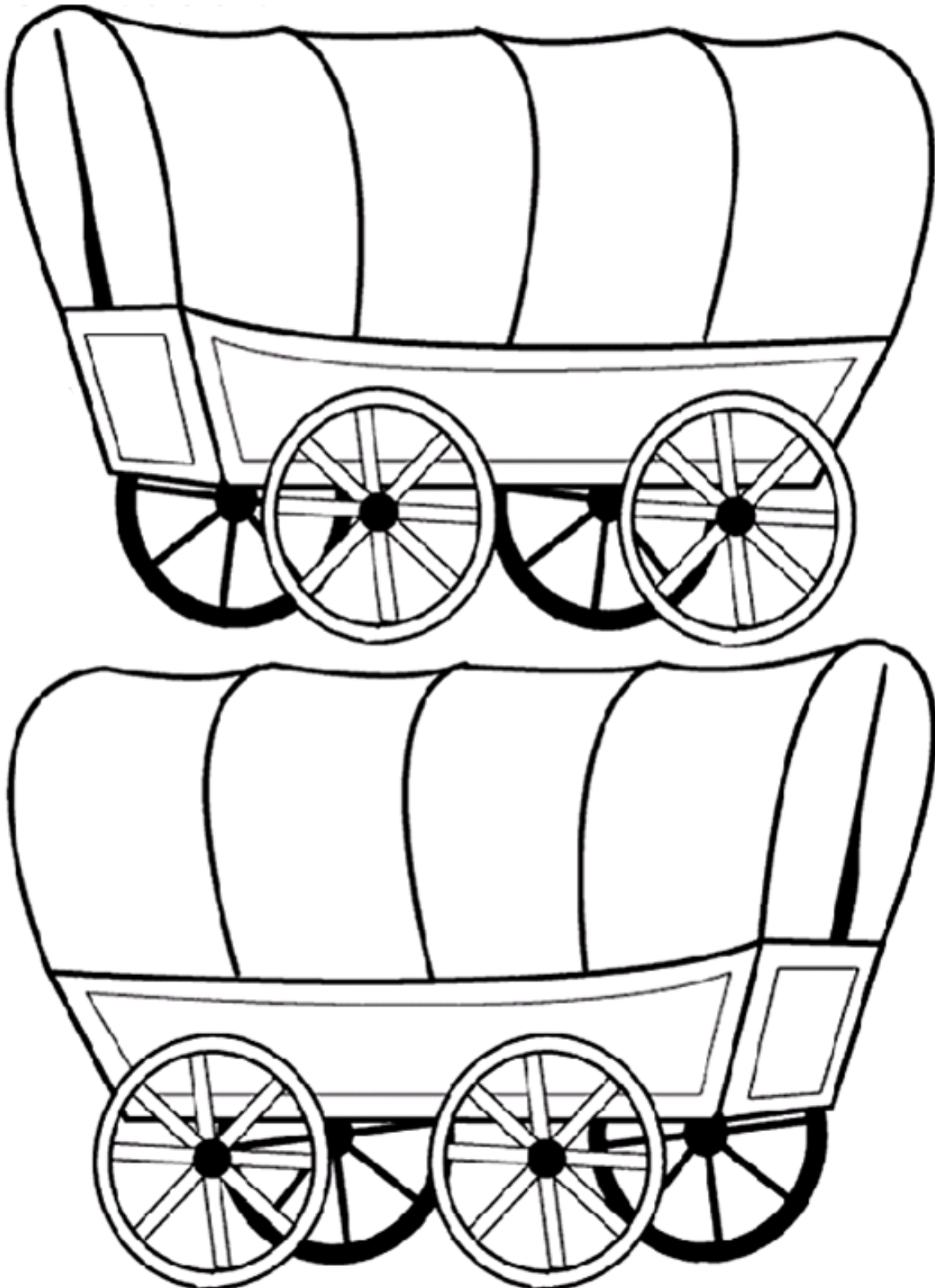


Make a Covered Wagon
