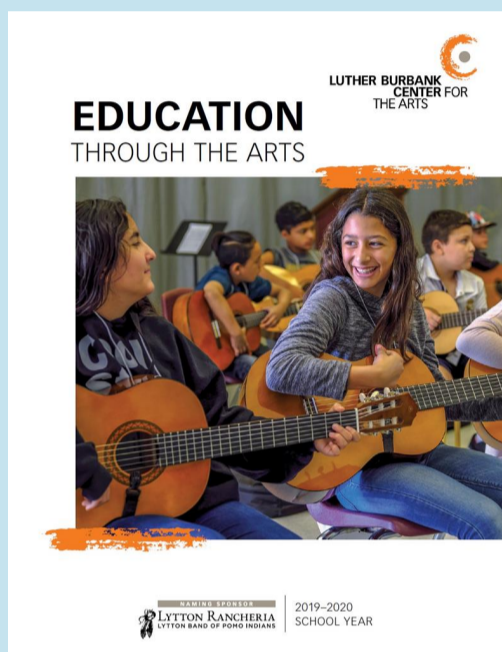




Education Programs On Sale August 7 at 9:00am!

The official on-sale for our PK-12 education programs starts Wednesday, August 7, 2019 at 9:00am. We will accept requests in person, online, via fax, and via mail. In the interest of fairness, orders received before 9:00am on August 7th will not be accepted. Online applications will be available as soon as shows are open for sale. You'll note that there is not an application within the brochure itself, but you can find a printable version on our website.

While payment is not necessary for reservations, we do require payment within 30 days of processing your order and you may incur a late fee for invoices 30 days or more past due. Also, seating for School Shows is based on the date payment is received.
